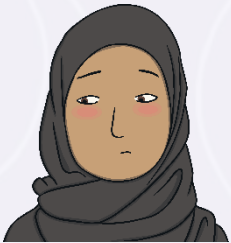

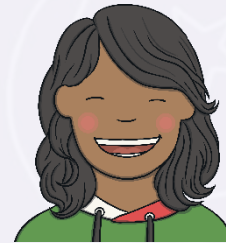

Eid al-Fitr is a special celebration at the end of Ramadan.

Eid al-Fitr means 'The Festival of Breaking of the Fast'.

Fasting during Ramadan means that Muslim people do not eat between sunrise and sunset.

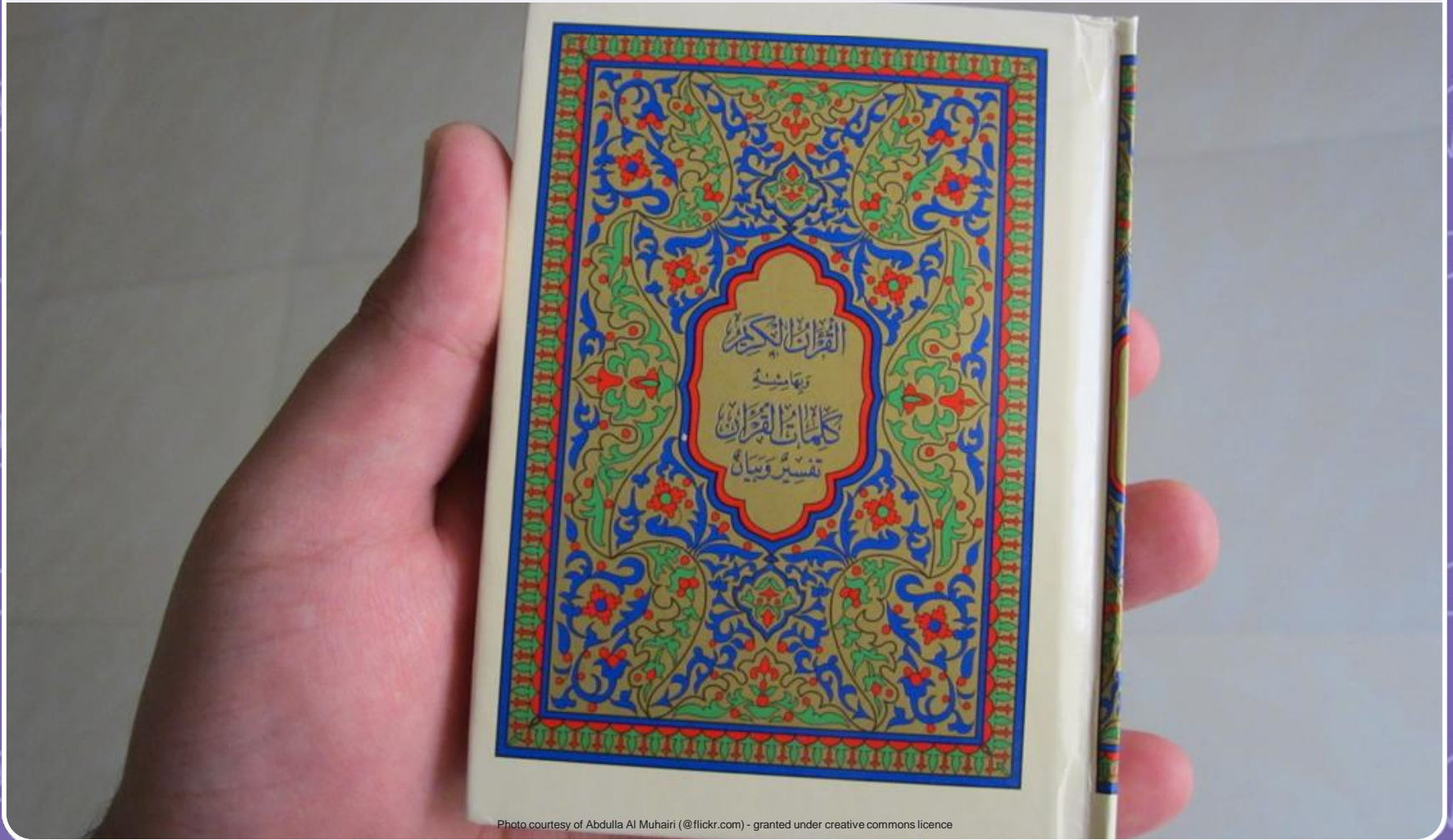

